## BOAT HARBOUR BEACH DOES IT AGAIN!



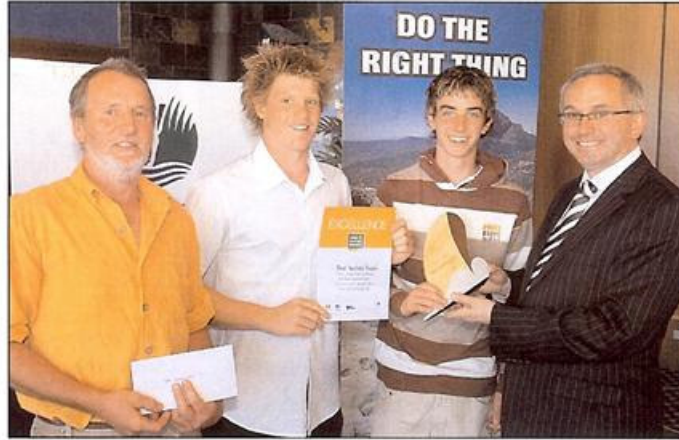
This year's winner was proudly entered, and justifiably so, by Boat Harbour Beach Surf Life Saving Club.
