**The City of Gosnells earns recognition at the
Australian Sustainable Cities Awards 2008**

The City of Gosnells has won the Environmental Innovation Award at the Keep Australia Beautiful, Australian Sustainable Cities Awards, held in Sydney last night.

The City of Gosnells is working together with the City of Armadale and the Serpentine Jarrahdale Shire, as the South East Regional Energy Group (SEREG), to encourage energy efficient and water-wise behaviour. SEREG developed partnerships with business, industry and residents, and introduced the 'Switch Your Thinking' (*syt!*) program with the aim of reducing regional greenhouse gas emissions.

Since the program's inception four years ago, SEREG and its project partners have invested more than half a million dollars in regional actions promoting energy and resource efficiency, helping reduce greenhouse gas emissions by some 250,000 tonnes.

According to the Australian Sustainable Cities Judge, Sean Rooney, who is also Director of the CSIRO Sustainable Communities Initiative, the City of Gosnells, and its partners, have developed a program that is relevant to all Councils throughout Australia.

"There is a lot of interest from other councils in using the *syt!* brand to help deliver their sustainability initiatives. With six Councils in WA already running the program and more to join the program in 2008/09, it has proven an innovative approach to addressing key environmental issues." Rooney said.

The awards were attended by The Hon Bruce Billson MP, Shadow Minister for Sustainable Development and Cities, who said:

"At a time when climate change, water conservation and waste reduction issues provide many challenges to local councils and communities, these awards help recognise and promote best practice case studies that can assist other urban communities to become more sustainable."

Also attending the awards dinner was Keep Australia Beautiful Ambassador, Miss Universe Australia 2008, Laura Dundovic.

"Congratulations to all of the participants for working hard to ensure the long term sustainability of their local community." Dundovic said.

The Australian Sustainable Cities Awards recognise efforts by residents, community groups, businesses and government agencies to protect and enhance their local environment to ensure its long term sustainability at all levels.

The program is sponsored by the Hungry Jack's 'Bag It & Bin It' program and is part of the Keep Australia Beautiful 'Australian Sustainable Communities' Awards, which also includes the Australian Tidy Towns and Australian Clean Beaches Awards.
