**Devonport City Council earns recognition at the  
Australian Sustainable Cities Awards 2008**

Devonport City Council has won the Heritage and Culture Award at the Keep Australia Beautiful, Australian Sustainable Cities Awards, held in Sydney last night.

According to the Australian Sustainable Cities Judge, Sean Rooney, who is also Director of the CSIRO Sustainable Communities Initiative, "Devonport is a city that takes great pride in protecting and enhancing the local environment and places great focus on preserving much of its past heritage and culture.

"The Maritime Museum is a jewel in the Crown of Devonport that is run by a dedicated team of volunteers with a passion for local history. The Museum is recognised as a nationally significant collection, and is a credit to the work and interest shown by its curators.

"Home Hill is another noteworthy heritage project being undertaken by the Devonport City Council in partnership with the National Trust. By restoring and developing Home Hill to its full potential they are working to ensure a significant era in Australia's political history is not lost to future generations." Rooney said.

The awards were attended by The Hon Bruce Billson MP, Shadow Minister for Sustainable Development and Cities, who said:

"At a time when climate change, water conservation and waste reduction issues provide many challenges to local councils and communities, these awards help recognise and promote best practice case studies that can assist other urban communities to become more sustainable."

Also attending the awards dinner was Keep Australia Beautiful Ambassador, Miss Universe Australia 2008, Laura Dundovic. "Congratulations to all of the participants for working hard to ensure the long term sustainability of their local community."

The Australian Sustainable Cities Awards recognise efforts by residents, community groups, businesses and government agencies to protect and enhance their local environment to ensure its long term sustainability at all levels.

The program is sponsored by the Hungry Jack's 'Bag It & Bin It' program and is part of the Keep Australia Beautiful 'Australian Sustainable Communities' Awards, which also includes the Australian Tidy Towns and Australian Clean Beaches Awards.
