

‘Enviably city’ wins two awards for its beauty

MOST Coasters would already know Burnie is beautiful, but now it's confirmed.

The city picked up two awards in yesterday's state Keep Australia Beautiful Awards.

The waterfront development won the Burnie City Council the Clean Beach Award, making it a national finalist.

Burnie's North Toe streetscape project also won the Certificate of Excellence Award under the Community Action Category.

Burnie Mayor Alwyn Boyd said the Burnie waterfront was the envy of Australian towns and cities.

"We have something special that we should all be proud of."

A judge assessed the waterfront around a month ago and will be back again at the end of the month to judge for the nationals.

Burnie picked up a similar award a few years ago.
