Launceston, TAS, wins Heritage & Culture Award at the Australian Sustainable Cities Awards 2009

The Launceston City Council has won the Heritage & Culture category award at the Keep Australia Beautiful, Australian Sustainable Cities Awards.

The winners were announced by Parliamentary Secretary for Social Inclusion and the Voluntary Sector, Senator the Hon Ursula Stephens, and Keep Australia Beautiful National Chairman, Don Chambers at Parliament House in Canberra last night.

According to the Australian Sustainable Cities Judge, Sean Rooney, who is also the Sustainability Program Manager at Sinclair Knight Merz, the City of Launceston has demonstrated leadership and collaboration in managing, interpreting and celebrating the city's natural environment and cultural heritage.

"Of particular note is the redevelopment of the Inveresk Precinct. This has seen the former railway yards converted into a vibrant centre for culture, education and sport and successfully incorporates sustainable design features and energy and water saving technologies.

Buildings in the precinct were converted to house the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery, the University of Tasmania campus for Visual & Performing Arts, and the School of Architecture.

"Special mention should also be given to the dedication and tireless efforts of numerous individuals and groups involved in conservation projects including the Cataract Gorge Volunteers Group, High Street Horse Trough, City Park Conservatory, Albert Hall, Artist in Residence program, Queen Victoria Museum, and Royal Park restoration works", Rooney added.

The Australian Sustainable Cities Awards recognise efforts by residents, community groups, businesses and government agencies to protect and enhance their local environment to ensure its long term sustainability at all levels. The Awards are sponsored by Packaging Stewardship Forum 'Do the Right Thing' program; Grundfos Pumps; Sinclair Knight Merz (SKM) and ToysRUs.

The overall Australian Sustainable Cities 2009 winner was City of Canada Bay, NSW.
