### Lithgow gets ready to impress as the Australian Tidy Towns Judge visits this week

The community of Lithgow is eagerly anticipating the arrival of the Australian Tidy Towns Awards Judge, Dick Olesinski, this week as it vies for the coveted title of Australia's Tidiest Town.

As part of his national judging visit, Olesinski will arrive in Lithgow on Wednesday to check out the many projects undertaken within the community that earned Lithgow the prestigious state title of NSW's Tidiest Town.

Olesinski will be evaluating the initiatives against the national awards criteria which encompass environmental innovation and protection, water and energy conservation, community partnerships, litter prevention, resource recovery and protection of local heritage and culture.

According to Olesinski, "Each of Tidy Towns national finalists should be extremely proud of their efforts as they provide inspiration and practical case studies that other communities can learn from to protect and preserve their local environment, culture and heritage."

"It's great to see how the dedicated work of individuals, community groups, industry and local council can successfully come together to achieve positive environmental outcomes that helps ensure their town and region can move forward sustainably", he added.

Olesinski's tour of Lithgow will start Wednesday afternoon where he will review the joint initiative of Lithgow Council and Delta Electricity to build cycle and walk paths within the town. He will also visit the Tree View Estate Retirement village whose initiative to harvest storm water for recycling has led to improved water conservation.

During his two day visit, he will view the Swamp Water Initiative project and other energy efficiency projects introduced around town, as well as the Water Transfer System to move excess ground water from the Clarence Colliery mine to the Lithgow water supply for treatment. A stop off at the Waste Transfer Facility will demonstrate how the facility has successfully led to increased resource recovery and diversion of waste from landfill.

Olesinski's tour will end with a visit to the Small Arms Museum to meet the local volunteers of the community who have been working to protect the town's proud history.

Following his national tour of the state and territory finalists, Olesinski will then face the tough task of deciding who will be crowned the national winner, to be announced in Canberra in April 2011, following the success of the Victorian town of Beechworth in April this year.
