- Territory Tidy Towns – first commenced in Northern Territory in 1981 and continues till this day (30 years).
- TALC – Territory Anti Litter Committee, (not sure what year commenced but it looks like it was around 1980 and dissolved around 2000), was a packaging industry funded body administrated through the NT Dept of Lands and Housing and Local Government with committee representatives consisting of personnel from Industry, Local Gov, Territory Gov and KAB with shared outcomes to control litter in NT, create awareness to reuse and recycling which included Awards – similar in format to Tidy Towns concept.
- The 'Beer Can Regatta' – introduced in partnership with the Darwin Lions Club in 1974 and is still running, it is a major tourist attraction highlight event (though now it's administered and operated by the Lions Club solely).
- The Darwin 'Garden Fair' was initiated and launched in NT by KABC(NT) back in ??? – still going strong today and is another highlight on the Top End Calendar, again it is not administrated by KABC(NT) anymore and has evolved into the 'Tropical Garden Spectacular and Top End Sustainable Living Festival' funded by local Nursery and Horticultural Industry Group.

The 'Green thumb' Awards program was commenced in ??? by KABC(NT) in partnership with Power and Water Authority (PAWA), PAWA now run and administer their own Environmental Awards program.
